### Challenge & Purpose

- Challenge: Mobilizing state APA Chapter sustainability.
- Purpose: Explore how state chapters and the new national APA Sustainable Communities
   Division can collaborate to advance sustainability planning.



### State APA Chapters – Research

- Research project led to article and session
- Involved a website review & email to presidents
- □ 35 state chapters responded
  - 4 interested in how to start a sustainability committee
  - Some chapters have limited capacity, limited public interest, or face anti-sustainability sentiment
  - 5 states have sustainability committees

CA, CO, FL, MA, NJ

- Other long-standing initiatives:
  - OR has sustainability toolkit & strategic initiative
  - OR & WA collaborate on "Game Changing Initiatives"

### State APA Chapters – Research

- Assessment--State Chapters Face Following Challenges:
  - Resources, education, and capacity for complexity of challenge
  - A constructively engaged public
  - Best practices tools
  - Committee start-up capacity
  - Clear strategic framework focused on end-game, net-zero/ positive impacts
  - On-going innovation to invent/achieve sustainability
- □ Conclusion:
  - Best way to predict the future is to invent it.
  - Being less bad is not being good (McDonough). Getting to good is our challenge.
