

# **2010 BOARD ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

As reported to APA California Chapter at Board Retreat January 14, 2011:

- We revised and adopted our bylaws in May (last revised in 2006). We eliminate one position and added two others (CPF Liaison and Young Planner's Group Coordinator).
- We hosted a very successful awards banquet at the Sir Francis Drake Hotel in San Francisco with over 120 people attending. Attendance exceeded our expectations by 30 people. Eight of the section winners went on to win state awards. We are hopeful that a few will win at the national level.
- For the June issue of *Northern News*, we prepared a simple budget breakdown for Section members.
- We organized a group of volunteer planners to provide services to the City of San Bruno in the wake of the disastrous explosion of the natural gas pipeline.
- We represented the Section and the state at the presentation of APA's Great Places in America award to the Ferry Building on October 13.
- We created a Sustainability subcommittee to address organizing sustainability events, understand member's concerns regarding sustainability, and plan for sustainable future. The subcommittee drafted a membership questionnaire to understand member needs and help focus the Section's priorities for 2011.
- We organized a mentorship program for new professionals that pairs them with more seasoned professionals. This is a pilot program and will run through June 2011. If it is successful, we will expand and continue the program into the future.
- The 2010 Holiday Party was quite successful. We held it at Farmers Market Bistro in Oakland and had 83 attendees. We raised about \$500 for CPF through our drawing and direct donations.

The California Planning Foundation's annual auction was held at the APA California Conference in Carlsbad on November 2. A record-breaking \$29,000 was raised in 2010 from the annual auction at the conference as well as from donations received throughout the year. This year's goal is to break that record.

CPF will hold its annual walking tours on Friday, May 13th in Sacramento and Santa Monica this year. Over the last four years, the tours have been in San Francisco (twice), Oakland, and San José. All money collected from these tours goes directly into the scholarship fund. Even though this year's event is in Sacramento, we'll encourage Northern Section members to attend.

Scholarship applications will be due on March 25, 2011. First year students at UC Berkeley and at San José State University are strongly encouraged to apply. The departmental chairs from the non-accredited university planning programs will also be submitting names of their top students for a different set of scholarships.

Northern News became a longer, wordier newsletter in 2010—a trend that began in 2008. And—while it is hard to measure—it appears the newsletter may not have been as well read as during the previous year. All three editors (Knox, Miyasato, and Teng) were involved throughout the year in seeking, preparing, and editing content, and in producing the publication.

#### Length and content

The December-January issue of Northern News was the 53rd under editor Naphtali H. Knox, FAICP. It was also the longest: 12,670 words. In 2010, the average length was 9,500 words. In 2009, the average length was 8,100 words.

More words means more content, but what kind? Northern News has been striving for "original content"—something not previously published and in most cases authored by someone local. Excluded from the definition of "original content" are the Director's notes, RAC reports, original or regurgitated announcements, and anything where the content comes from wire sources, press releases, or wire services (e.g., What others are saying, Northern California roundup, HSR notes).

With that as a definition, 30 "original content" articles were published in last year's 10 issues:

- June, no original content articles.
- February and July/August: 2 original content articles each issue.
- March, May, and November: 3 original content articles each issue.
- April, October, and December/January: 4 original content articles each issue.
- September: 5 original content articles.

The February issue will publish an alphabetical list of **Northern News'** 2010 authors (28 local; three from outside the area) and their article titles.

#### **Readership and membership**

Web download statistics are problematic. They vary in ways that withstand simple explanations. For example, the data show 13,509 downloads of the June *2009* issue, but only 1578 downloads of the June *2010* issue. Was it because the June 2010 issue had no original content? Or because it was the last month that ran "Planners seeking employment? Doesn't seem probable.

The law of averages is still working, however. Comparing all of 2009 with all of 2010, it appears the number of downloads (a proxy for number of readers) is down 20-30 percent. Over the same period, membership levels declined 15 percent.

# The arithmetic

If you look at the nine issues for which there are data in 2009 (Dec 08/Jan 09 through Nov 09), we had a total of 79,954 downloads, nine issues, or 8884 downloads per issue. For the eight issues for which there are data in 2010 (Dec 09/Jan 10 through Sept 10) we had a total of 49,503 downloads, eight issues, for an average of 6188 downloads per issue. That's an average drop of 2696 per issue, or 30 percent. Even *The New York Times* would be concerned.

Now look at downloads per month (all *Northern News* downloads, regardless of which issue, by month of the download). From December 2008 through November 2009, we had 79,087 downloads, 12 months, 6591 downloads per month. From December 2009 through November 2009, we had 58,560 downloads, 11 months, for an average of 5324 downloads per month. That's an average drop of 1267 per month, or 19 percent. Yes, *The New York Times* would still be concerned.

*Northern News* has been listing its circulation as 8500 per issue. That should now be dropped to 6000.

# The reason

There could be many reasons for the drop in circulation relating to length, quality, layout, or method of delivery of the News. Other possibilities are the professional groups on LinkedIn and/or our growing attention to Facebook. Right now, we have no way to examine those possibilities. But we could examine the falling APA membership as a possible reason. Is it behind the decline in readership?

To answer that question, we chose as a proxy for membership the number of entries in the Northern Section mailing list provided about quarterly by National APA. Based on the length of the list, the size of our reader base is shrinking: On 12-15-2008, the list had 1855 line entries. By 9-11-2009, the number of line entries dropped to 1688. On 12-7-2010, the

number of entries was 1576. So the mailing list (most recently at 1576 entries) has dropped by 279, or 15 percent from its 1855 two years earlier.

#### Webmaster: Pierce MacDonald

On October 29, 2010 I asked for suggestions to update the Section's website, <u>www.norcalapa.org</u>

The response was fantastic and many of the changes and new content were added to the site immediately, under our existing agreement with the web designer, Audrey. Please check out the new Diversity, South Bay RAC, Students/University Representative, and Young Planners Group web pages at <a href="http://www.norcalapa.org">www.norcalapa.org</a>, under Committees.

The web site has been busy hosting the PayPal registration for this year's events, including the very successful Holiday Party, Awards Dinner and YPG Public Engagement/Social Networking events. These events represented several hundred unique on-line registrations. The potential to use PayPal for sponsorship invoicing in the future is promising.

Other website improvements include a Board information page (at the bottom of the Board Directory page), technical changes including the consistent use of "Section" on the website. Timely calendar, newsletter, and job announcement postings. Posting dates and 'last updated' dates have been added to the homepage and many postings.
